Champions chasing history

Three-time major winner Brooks Koepka leads the charge to be the first American winner of the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship, but England's Tyrrell Hatton won't give up his title without a fight as he aims for hat-trick

Two great champions will be hoping to make history at this week's Alfred Dunhill Links Championship.

Reigning US Open and US PGA champion Brooks Koepka could become the first ever American winner, while trying to create a remarkable record of his own is England's Tyrrell Hatton, bidding to become the first man to win three straight titles.

Also in the mix in this potential Europe v USA re-match over the great links courses of St Andrews, Carnoustie and Kingsbarns is Ryder Cup hero Tommy Fleetwood and

American Tony Finau, making his debut in the event.

Koepka said: "I'm delighted to be back at the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship. Last time I played it was with my dad Bob, and it was a few days I will never forget. Being able to do that at the Home of Golf in such a prestigious competition with the great Scottish galleries was a unique moment for both of us."

"I managed to shoot 64 on the Old Course in front of him, which made me very proud. It was a great father-and-son moment. St Andrews is

my favourite place to play golf."

On this occasion Koepka will be partnered in the Team Championship by his long-time Northern Irish caddie Ricky Elliott, who has helped him to win three of the last six Majors.

"He's a big part of my success," added Koepka. "It's a kind of treat for him this week, especially after the year we've had. It's fun and hopefully he plays well and he's not too nervous and can enjoy it."

No one had won back-to-back Alfred Dunhill Links Championships until Hatton's success last year, and

now he is attempting to push the boundaries even further.

"It's more relaxing than other weeks," he said. "My game's in a good place and I'll be trying my best to make it three in a row. I don't feel too bad after Sunday's Ryder Cup celebrations. I don't see why I can't win again. All I can do is my best."

One of Tyrrell's secret weapons for the last two years, amateur partner Jamie Dornan, will not be at his side this time. The hugely popular actor is filming and is not able to play, but Hatton has world-famous footballer Ruud Gullit as a high-class substitute.

"If you can play with someone you can get on well with, have a bit of a laugh between shots, that's helpful, because you are a team that week," added Hatton.

"We've had good fun these past two years, but Jamie can't play this year. I'm playing with Ruud and that should be great."

"It's a week like no other. St Andrews is such a special place. It's a great feeling when you step on to the first tee. It's good to be back, and you get to play two other great courses as well."



Westlife star aiming to top the charts again

After a second-placed finish last year, Brian McFadden is looking for another No1 – with help from a Rock star

Brian McFadden has experienced the drama of a Sunday at St Andrews in the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship – and he wants more. The Westlife star finished second in the Team Championship last year and watched partner Robert Rock tie for fourth place in the pro event.

As Rock and McFadden, left, team up for a third successive year, the singer has high expectations.

"Last year was unbelievable," said McFadden, who lost out by three shots to Kieran McManus, the Irish stud farm owner, and his pro Jamie Donaldson.

"We just made the cut and then

we ended up finishing second. I think we shot 14 or 15 under on the Sunday. For Rocky to finish in the top five and for us to finish second was amazing, but we are hoping to go one better this year.

"Playing on the final day is so different. I remember going down to the range on the Sunday morning. On a normal day there are lots of people around but on a Sunday there are only maybe 10 people. I'm standing next to players like Rory McIlroy. It was bizarre.

"Sunday is the business end of the tournament and I was the only amateur in my group so I was a bit

Right time, right place for Tommy

Tommy Fleetwood tees off at the 18th at St Andrews yesterday, and afterwards said there was no place he'd rather be following the drama and jubilation of Europe's Ryder Cup win.

"The Ryder Cup was my best feeling in golf and it's been great to relive those moments," said Fleetwood, who shot a course-record 63 at Carnoustie in last year's Championship. "But this is the perfect week to follow all of that. It's the format, the fact that I play with Ogden [Phipps, his amateur partner] every year. St Andrews is my favourite place to come."



Jiménez cherishes his senior moment

The popular Spaniard returns to the scene of his recent Major success to rekindle his Championship memories

One of the world's most popular golfers, Spain's Miguel Angel Jiménez, returns to the Old Course this week to play in the Alfred Dunhill Links, barely two months after winning the British Seniors Open here, beating Bernhard Langer by one shot.

He said: "It was an amazing week and very emotional. Everyone wants to win a Major Championship at the Home of Golf and so to win the Senior Open on the first occasion it was held at St Andrews was so special."

Jiménez last played in the Alfred Dunhill Links in 2012 and says he is looking forward to coming back.

"We play three amazing links golf

courses and with friends, which is even better," he said. "I always play with interesting amateurs, which is great, particularly when you know you are going to spend at least three days playing together."

"I cannot say I have a favourite, but one year I was partnered with Hugh Grant and another year with Bill Murray and both guys are really funny, great company and lots of laughs."

Anyone looking for a bet on a possible hole-in-one could do worse than having a punt on Jiménez. He had his 10th hole-in-one at the BMW PGA Championship in 2015 – still a European Tour record.

wary about that. You try to make your shots quick and get out the road.

"I think we were one ahead going onto the 16th – then we parred 16 and 17 and birdied 18 but it wasn't enough."

McFadden claims he found the key to success in his first year at the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship – making sure he enjoys himself off the course as well as on it. He says relaxing with the friends he has made at the event is every bit as important as what happens on the golf course.

"In my first year here (2016), myself and Rocky were sharing a room," recalled McFadden. "On the Monday and Tuesday nights he went to his bed at 7pm. I said I would do the same as him and not socialise during the week. But then I met Jamie Donaldson and we said 'come on let's go out and enjoy ourselves!' As soon as I relaxed and enjoyed the whole experience I played a lot

better. Every night is great crack in the hotel. The golf is secondary to the crack."

McFadden is just one of a super group of music stars playing in the Championship. He is joined by his friend and former boy band star Ronan Keating, Keane's Tom Chaplin, Linkin Park's Dave Farrell, Mike Rutherford from Genesis, country and western singer Clay Walker and hugely popular legends Huey Lewis and Bon Jovi's Tico Torres, right.

Walker was diagnosed with MS in 1996, but is now in remission after treatment and has set up his own charity 'Band Against MS'. He earned \$50,000 for the charity after winning the Million Dollar Hole shootout in this year's AT&T Pro-Am.

He says: "Golf has been a great barometer for where I am with the illness. If something is not exactly right, I can feel it in my golf swing immediately."





Fit Donald fired up by Ryder Cup

After over five months out with a back injury and a weekend spent tantalisingly close to the Ryder Cup action, Englishman Luke Donald is desperate to begin his comeback at the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship.

After finishing tied seventh here last year, Donald's game was hampered by an injury that eventually forced him out of action in April.

He spent his hiatus receiving treatment, taking rest and impressing on television commentary duty, and returns for an event in which he has recorded four top-ten finishes.

"After five months out I feel like I am making good progress with my back," said Donald.

"I'm looking forward to getting out there and testing it, and seeing how I do. I was excited to play 18 at St Andrews on Tuesday, it was great to dust the clubs off and I'm looking forward to competing."

Donald was one of Thomas Bjorn's vice-captains as Europe won the Ryder Cup last week and the 40-year-old was blown away by the performance of the team.

"I was proud of the way they played against such a strong US team," he said. "To dominate the Ryder Cup in that way was very impressive."

And Donald revealed the Ryder Cup remains a motivation as he prepares for his comeback today.

"My aspiration is to be there in two years as a player," he added. "If not then I see myself playing some kind of role. It's a special event and it gives you some of your fondest memories on a golf course."



Friends reunited as familiar teams return

17 years after their first meeting, Paul McGinley and Kyle MacLachlan are one of several longstanding Dunhill pairs

Former Ryder Cup captain Paul McGinley and Hollywood star Kyle MacLachlan, pictured in 2007, reach a landmark this week when they play in their tenth Alfred Dunhill Links Championship. They first played together in 2001, the Championship's first year, when they made the cut.

Twin Peaks actor MacLachlan

recalls: "Paul was actually leading the tournament after three rounds, so he and I were the last group off the 1st tee on the Old Course in the final round. It's something I'll never forget. It was a magical experience."

Padraig Harrington is paired once again with fellow Irishman, race horse owner JP McManus. They won the



Sea change for Slater

Kelly Slater, the 11-time world surfing champion, swapped the sun-kissed beaches of his home in Hawaii for the autumnal swirl of the North Sea at Kingsbarns as he prepared for today's first round of the Alfred Dunhill Links Champi-

onship, and he wisely stayed out of the water this time. Matt Wallace, the pro partnering Slater as they start out in the Team Championship at St Andrews, should be happy with the pairing – Slater has twice played with the eventual

winner of the main event. In 2009 Simon Dyson claimed the title with Slater by his side, and six years later the American was walking down the 18th at the Old Course alongside Thorbjorn Olesen as he came through to win.

Team Championship in both 2002 and 2006 and are the only team to have achieved the feat twice.

Harrington, right with McManus, also won the individual professional championship in both years and said: "It was important to my career and it was nice to win both the amateur and individual. There's something missing if you don't win both of them."

Keiran McManus, son of JP, will be bidding for a record fourth Team Championship, but with a new partner this year, Freddie Jacobson.

One of the most popular pairings will be four-time Major champion Ernie Els, who will be playing with his father Neels for the eighth time.



The Alfred Dunhill Links Championship celebrates links golf at its finest and is played over the Old Course at St Andrews, the Championship Course at Carnoustie and Kingsbarns Golf Links. The final round, after the cut is made on Saturday, is played over the Old Course.

With a total prize fund of US\$5 million, there are two separate competitions - an individual professional tournament and the Team Championship, in which each professional is paired with an amateur.

13 years after caddying for his legendary father in his farewell Open Championship appearance at St Andrews, Steve Nicklaus is making his Alfred Dunhill Links debut

It was one of the most emotional moments ever witnessed on the Old Course, a place that has been touched by history so many times.

The Open Championship, July 2005 and Jack Nicklaus, the greatest golfer the world has ever seen, was playing in his last Major.

As he crossed the Swilken Bridge for the last time, Jack turned and waved to the adoring crowd pressed closely together to catch a last sight of the man who had been admired for so many years for his prodigious talent and his generosity of spirit.

As the crowd roared and he waved

back, there standing beside him was his son Steve, who had been given the extraordinary opportunity to caddie for his father in this treasured moment.

Now Steve is back on the Old Course, making his debut in this year's Alfred Dunhill Links.

He said: "The entire week bordered on magical. Then, walking up the 18th hole for the final time — seeing and hearing how the Scots and other golf fans showered him with love and appreciation — made for one of the most emotional and memorable experiences of my life.

"My father told us how he fell in love with St Andrews the first time he saw and played the Old Course in the 1964 Open Championship.

"So as we witnessed his two victories on the Old Course, we all developed our own love and respect for St Andrews.

"And with each special opportunity I have had to play the Old Course, my appreciation for it has only grown."

Vaughan looks to former winner to up his average

Vaughan will be partnered in the Team Championship by Ireland's Michael Hoey, who won the pro tournament in 2011. He would love for the pair to tee it up on the Old Course come Sunday.

"I've not played with Michael

before but he won it here in 2011 and the Irish guys generally know how to play in a bit of wind because they've had to do so throughout their career," said Vaughan.

"I've only made the cut once, with Danny Willett. It'd be nice to make Sunday, but it's great to have a chance to play the courses and to spend every evening with friends is what the tournament is all about."

Vaughan was inspired by the European Ryder Cup team's victory over the United States in Paris, and is excited to be rubbing shoulders with stars from both teams this week.

"After what must have been a huge emotional rollercoaster in Paris, this is a more relaxed event and the crowds will certainly get behind the new folk hero, Tommy Fleetwood," said Vaughan. "I like the way he plays golf, the way he speaks. Also, having Tony Finau and Brooks Koepka here from the US team is a treat for everyone."

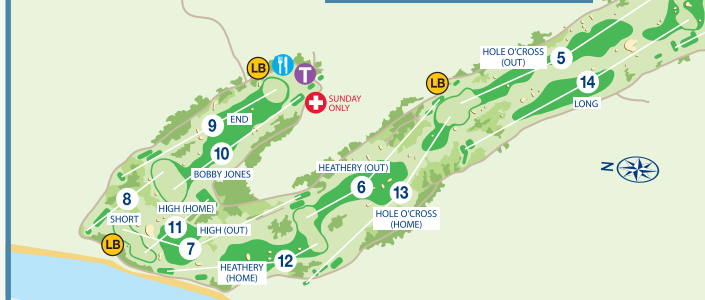

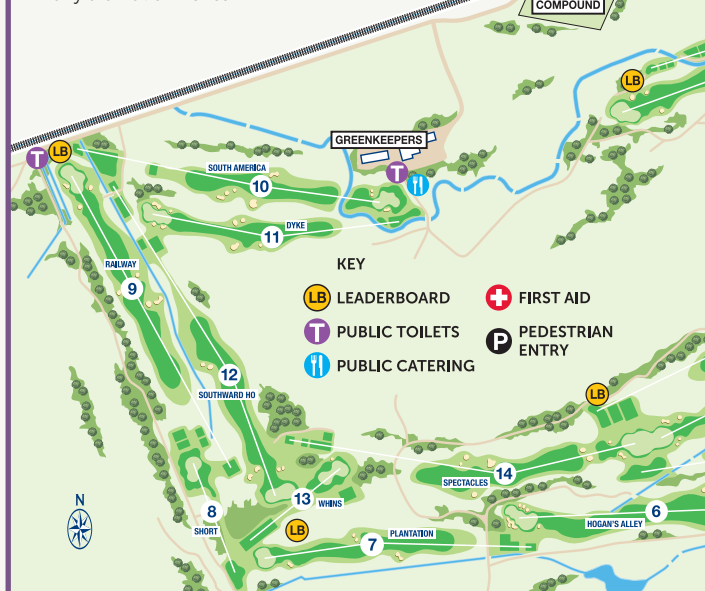

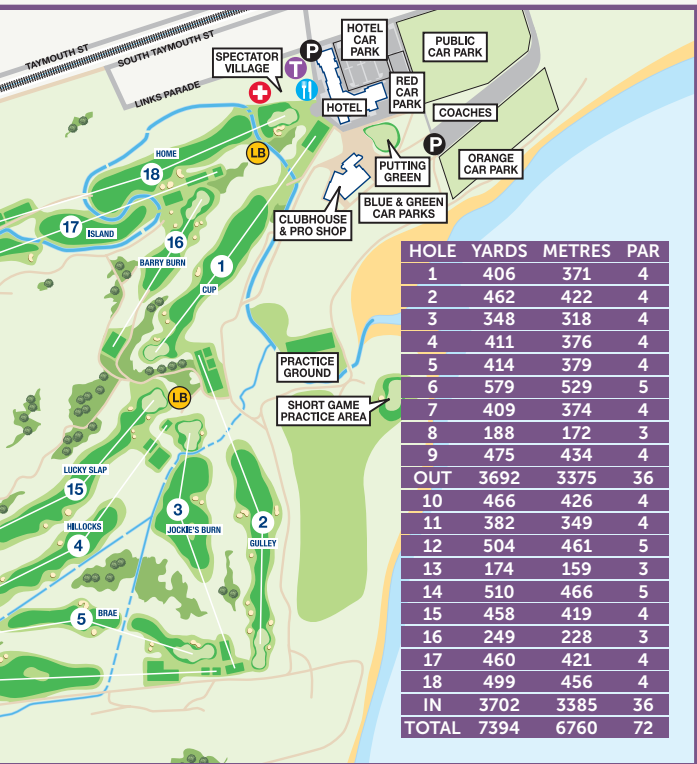


Carnoustie
